



Beer, wine and geology in the Eifel area

With Jack Lanting as our excursion leader we will visit some of the highlights of the (western) Eifel region. Jack will introduce us to and give an explanation of how the Eifel vulcanism shaped the region. We will start with a visit of the Laacher See crater. The eruption which created the crater and lake was one the most explosive and recent (~13000 years ago) eruptions in the Eifel and the effects can be seen throughout the region. The Laacher See vulcano is dormant, but as witnessed by the release of CO₂ bubbles in the 'See' some activity remains.



In the Wingertsbergwand the different phases of the explosion can be unraveled. In this weekend we will see deposits of pyroclastic flows, different calderas, lahar deposits, some nice minerals and even some shales.



For the evening program we have time to look at some 'cultural' aspects of the Eifel-Mosel region. We will visit a wine yard & have wine tasting of the famous wineries along the Mosel and have a tour though the 'Vulkanbrauerij'.

Included: transport, hotel, food (breakfast, lunch, dinner, snacks), visits, food and some drinks.
